The P&C run the school band program, the Eco Food Garden which plants and cooks with the kids, and the canteen which provides lots of delicious, healthy foods. We also support the dance and school banking programs as well as assisting with maintenance of the school grounds. All of this relies entirely on the generous and enthusiastic contribution of volunteers.

P&C meetings

The P&C Association meets on the first Wednesday of each month during school terms at 7:00pm in the school staffroom. These meetings usually have an agenda that includes:

The Annual General Meeting is held in March each year at which time the election of office bearers takes place. We encourage you to get involved as much as possible. TERRACYCLE

P&C funds

committees is used to purchase items for inside and outside the classroom that do not fall within the Department of Education and Training funding. The decisions on how our funds are spent are made at the monthly P&C meetings. Sometimes events will be conducted with a specific fundraising purpose in mind, which is conveyed through notice of the event and the school newsletter.



Social events

The P&C also organises social events during the year to foster the community spirit. In recent years we have held BBQs and trivia nights. All events are publicised in the school newsletter and we welcome your participation.

Canteen

The HHPS canteen follows the healthy canteen guidelines as defined by the NSW Canteen Association. Our emphasis is on fresh, healthy and fun food.

Our aim is to run our school canteen as a self-funding service to the school community. The canteen employs a paid manager, and is supported by volunteers.

Currently we are open Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays for recess and lunch. All lunch orders are to be made via the P&C QKR! app.

Uniform shop

The HHPS Uniform Shop provides parents with the opportunity to purchase all school uniform items and accessories from quality suppliers at competitive prices.

You can also purchase very modestly priced second-hand items that have been donated - please check out the boxes/rack in the uniform shop.

The opening hours are usually every second Friday 8:30am to 9:30am. All items are ordered via the QKR! app with orders closing each Friday during school term, and delivery made to your child's class as soon as possible after that.

Second hand items are now paid for via QKR!, although you are able to come onsite to select from what is available.

Band

The HHPS Band Program has been running since 1973. The Program offers a Training Band for children new to their instrument, a Concert Band and a Performance Band to extend the really keen musicians. The bands rehearse once per week on Tuesdays after school. All children in years 3-6 are welcome to join. The bands are conducted by professional conductors and the program is organised by the volunteer parent band committee.

The Bands enjoy performing at school and community events as well as participating in eisteddfods. A band camp is the highlight of the year, held over two school days, supported by teachers, conductors, music tutors and volunteer parents. The band camp results in considerable improvement to each child's individual ability and the band as a whole. In recent years, the camp has been held at Camp Kedron. All band members are encouraged to attend.

Band members are required to receive tuition for their chosen instrument. To facilitate this, the Band Committee arranges for tutors to come to the school and provide tuition during school hours. Children may choose to have outside tuition.

Instruments are allocated to children most suited to a particular instrument as indicated by an aptitude test. The Band Committee has a number of instruments for hire. Children may also hire instruments from music shops or purchase their own instrument new or second hand.

Band Fees are charged to cover band expenses including: conductor fees, competition entry fees, expenses incurred in buying music, purchasing and replacing equipment. In 2023 the annual fees were: \$390 Training Band (includes a method book), \$360 Concert & Performance Band. Optional instrument hire \$270. Band camp \$230. Private tuition fees additional.



and maintain much of the outdoor environment of the school.

A team of volunteers from the school community tend the gardens, mow the lawns and regularly perform other maintenance activities around the school.

Working bees are also held to enhance and build upon the existing grounds presentation and maintain outdoor equipment often on weekends several times throughout the year. Parents are encouraged to participate in the working bees, which are also a great way to meet and socialise with other families.


Bushland Fair
