
Bushland Fair






















Planning for 2023

We will evaluate with students on how the new furniture is impacting their learning environment.

Last Day of Term 4 and Staff Development Day

As per the notification via Enews last week, Students will now finish school on Friday 16 December 2022. This is due to an additional School Development Day announced for staff across NSW public schools. School Development Days allow our staff to participate in professional learning that was put on hold due to COVID-19 staffing pressures and plan ahead for 2023 to ensure we meet the needs of our students. Mrs Cullimore has been a wonderful team player, expert teacher and wonderful music teacher at HHPS. Mrs Cullimore has added much value to our school with leading musical events and Professional Learning for staff at HHPS in the area of music. She has been a valued committee and stage member at our school and her passion and drive for success will be missed. Mrs Cullimore is one of our permanent teacher and we hope she will return to us in time. Miss Ridley will take over from Mrs Cullimore as Choir teacher and Mrs Cassie Pethybridge will join class 2C till the end of the year.

Presentation Day

This year our Presentation Day will be celebrated across 2 events: K-2 and 3-6. Due to the rules around COVID 19 relaxing slightly, we are able to invite parents to the event. We ask that 1-2 parents per child only attend so we can still remain physically distanced. The Dance and Choir will be performing at both events as well as one of the bands. K-2 will be singing a song at their Presentation Day. 3-6 will not be performing a song as their events are much longer than K-2. Each teacher will do a short class recognition and some awards will be handed out for each class. Each teacher hands out 6 awards per class where 2 are a Teacher Choice Award, 2 Excellence in Academic Achievement, a citizenship Award and a Commitment to Improvement Award. If your child is receiving an award at one of the presentations day events, you will be involved of this prior to the event.

Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2024

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods. 


