Over the past few days visiting classrooms I have seen Launch, Explore, Summarise maths lessons in action, Stage 1 creating Sound-Scapes for their Music Project Based Learning unit of work, a Maths lesson that incorporated area, perimeter, 2D shapes and 3D objects connected to a city scape as well as impressive writing in Kindergarten!

I was invited into Kindergarten's presentation of the farms they created in groups which showcased their learnt knowledge of what belongs on a farms and what sort of things we see and do on a farm. Happy Holidays

I hope you all have a restful holiday break. Our last day of Term 3 is Friday September 23rd and our first day back for the term is Monday 10th October. There is no Staff Development day at the start of the Term 4 (It is at the end of the year).

Public Holiday Confirmed - Thursday 22 September

We wish to acknowledge the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and recognise her 70 years of dedicated service as our monarch. Thursday 22 September has been confirmed as a 'National Day of Mourning for Queen Elizabeth II'. This means that our school will be non-operational (closed).

Staffing News - Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction (APCI)

The panel for the APCI position at HHPS has been run and in 2023 we will warmly welcome Mrs Nicole Tudor to the 3 day a week position at the school as Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction. The APCI position is a leadership role dedicated to ensuring that literacy and numeracy knowledge and skills are embedded in curriculum and assessment; high quality teaching practices are enhanced; and the capabilities of middle leaders are strengthened in literacy and numeracy instruction. It shares the broader educational imperatives of the Assistant Principal position but with an explicit focus on the leadership of effective, evidence-based literacy and numeracy teaching and assessment practices for improved student learning outcomes across the curriculum. The Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction provides high support and guidance to enhance teacher growth and development in literacy and numeracy and strengthens schoolwide instructional capabilities across the curriculum for middle and senior leaders.

What is Project Based Learning?

At HHPS we use many different types of teaching methods and Project Based Learning is one of them! Project Based Learning is a teaching method in which students gain knowledge and skills by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to an authentic, engaging,

and complex question, problem, or challenge. Each year group has been working on a unit of work with Project Based Learning which comprises of the following:

- A Driving Question
- Significant content
- Critical Thinking, Problem Solving, Collaboration and Communication
- Voice and Choice
- Critique and revision
- Public Audience

Year 6 Mufti Day

This Friday Year 6 are holding a Mufti Day in order to raise money for their Year 6 farewell dinner. It is tradition that Year 6 each year do this and all the students in this year group appreciate students across the school donating a gold coin this Friday in exchange to wear Mufti.

Maths Strategy

At HHPS we were very lucky to be given the opportunity to be part of the NSW Maths Strategy initiative. This involved the school going through an application process. Over the last 2 years we have benefitted having Mrs Cheryl Baker be our school's primary teacher who was selected to become an expert in teaching mathematics. Mrs Baker spends 2 and a half days a week taking part in this program where she is upskilled in the area of mathematics and then leads the school through her learning. Through this program we have:

- Built a focus on Mathematical mindsets for students
- Establish the understanding with learners that Maths is a process not an answer
- Worked on the area of reasoning
- Worked on further developing open ended questioning and lessons that are accessible to all students
- Focuss on what good mathematicians do
- Implemented Number Talks School wide
- Started to model and implement the teaching method of Launch, Explore, Summarise into classrooms
- Started to implement lessons that join one

strand of Mathematics to another (connected mathematical learning- see photos of this later in the Newsletter)

- Mrs Baker has modelled lessons to teachers and worked with classes and teachers
- Ensured that teachers have had the opportunity to observe others teach mathematics and be observed themselves
- Worked on asking questions that get students thinking deeply and promote productive struggle!
- Led staff through many Mathematics Professional Learning sessions (Led by the Maths Committee - Mrs Baker, Mr Young, Miss Chatburn, and Mrs Cornell)
- Fortnightly Mathematical Matters Problems in the Newsletter

The good news is that this program has just been extended at our school by another year. This is due to the disruption that COVID has played throughout the last 2 years. We are absolutely over the moon about this, as we have had a great deal of success with this model of learning. We thank Mrs Baker for her hard work and passion in the area of mathematics as well as the Maths Committee and all teachers for taking such an active role in all things mathematics!

Mathematical Matters


Research tells us that highly effective teaching of mathematics and numeracy highlights connections between content and skills, whilst also building on students' understandings and reasoning.

Our 4M mathematicians demonstrated their understanding of length, area, perimeter, 2D shape and 3D objects when they participated in a mini project based learning activity called 'Geometricity'.

Students used, applied and connected their learning in these areas to plan and create a section of a city, taking into account area and perimeter, and creating their own 3D nets. This is just a small snapshot of the amazing mathematicians at HHPS!



Parking near driveways, footpaths and pedestrian kerb ramps



Parking near driveways

- When parking legally near a driveway, you must ensure that no part of your vehicle blocks the driveway or access to the property at any time.
- A vehicle can be parked up to the wings of the driveway.
- A driver can drop off or pick up a passenger in front of a driveway, however it is an offence to leave a vehicle unattended or to not move their vehicle at the request of the property owner.

Parking near footpaths and pedestrian kerb ramps

- When parking legally near a footpath or pedestrian kerb ramp, you must ensure that no part of your vehicle blocks access to the footpath or kerb ramp at any time.
- A vehicle can be parked up to the wings of the pedestrian kerb ramp.
- By parking correctly and considerately, you allow other vehicles and pedestrians to access properties or footpaths easily and safely, creating a safer environment for other road users.
