Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2024

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may

otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods. Class Decisions 2023

As we start to look forward to 2023, we will towards the end of the term begin the process of forming classes. We ask for your cooperation and trust in our professional judgement as we make decisions around this. Considerable thought about every students need is taken into account whilst forming classes. All teachers, executive staff and often the learning support team consult and communicate over a lengthy period to ensure every effort is made to achieve the best possible combination of teacher and learning cohorts. Over the course of your child's time at HHPS they will experience a variety of class combinations including, composite classes, mainstream groupings and job share arrangements.

Visible Learning and Learning Dispositions

At HHPS we use **Visible learning strategies** from the work of John Hattie. Visible Learning is a researched based approach that supports students and teachers in becoming effective learners by:

- displaying the characteristics of an effective learner
- understanding what they are learning, how are they going and where they will go
- giving, receiving and acting upon feedback to improve their learning

The school will be implementing Learning Dispositions particular to Hornsby Heights Public School early next year. Learning Dispositions refer to the way in which learners engage in and relate to the learning process. We are so exited to share these with you in 2023!

New Signage Installed

We have new signage being installed later in the week as well as promotional material. Large prints of our school song and the National Anthem in the hall will be installed as well as a brand new "Opportunity Board" which will be explained to all our students and families once we "unveil" it! We will also be receiving a much needed House Points board so we can keep track of all those points!

2023 Kindergarten Orientation effective, appropriate and prohibited practices, and

We are thrilled that we are able to welcome our 2023 Kindergarten students on Friday 18 November as well as on Friday 25 November from 9:30am - 10:45am for our Kindergarten Orientation sessions. All information regarding this event was sent out via Enews to the 'Pre-Kindergarten' group.

K-2 Toy Shed

Students in Class 2D wrote me a letter asking if they were allowed to create a toy shed in the K-2 playground. They had some amazing reasons to create this and so of course I said YES! We now have some very eager students in Stage 1 buying equipment to put in the toy shed and who have arranged a timetable of leaders to run the Toy Shed as well! I couldn't be prouder of these students for taking on their very own leadership project! A big thank you to Mrs Dunn who has been a motivator for these students and who has allowed their voices to be heard.

New policies, procedures and framework to keep students engaged in learning at school

The Inclusive, Engaging and Respectful (IER) Schools package was announced in February this year by NSW Minister for Education and Early Learning, Hon Sarah Mitchell. It centres on three new policies and procedures and a framework that together set the guidelines for how we ensure all children and young people can learn through public education in a safe and engaging way. The IER Schools package includes the:

- Inclusive Education Policy for students with disability
- Student Behaviour Policy and Procedures
- Restrictive Practices Framework and Restrictive Practices Reduction and Elimination Policy and Procedures.

With these new policies, we want all students to:

- be included in all aspects of school life and supported to learn to their fullest capability
- be supported in engaging, respectful, and effective classrooms with positive and inclusive practices
- feel welcomed, valued and safe in our schools and classroom

Two of the policies are new: the Inclusive Education Policy; and the Restrictive Practices Framework and policy. Both clarify existing legal obligations,

the rights of students, parents and carers.

The Student Behaviour Policy replaces the Student Discipline in Government Schools and Suspension and Expulsion Policy. The key change is the approach all NSW public schools will take to address disruptive or inappropriate behaviour by a student. The duration of a suspension will be reduced along with the number of suspensions across a school year. Every school will be able to draw on the support of a range of staff including behaviour specialists to effectively address issues resulting in these behaviours in order to prevent future escalations. We will continue to work closely with you and all our families.

It does not mean, however, that students who are violent or seriously disrupt the learning and wellbeing of others will be kept at school. Any student who puts the safety of other students, teachers and staff or visitors at risk of harm - will be suspended until it is safe for them to return. The Inclusive Education Policy for students with disability and the Student Behaviour Policy become operational in Term 4, 2022 and the Restrictive Practices Policy becomes operational in Term 1, 2023.

The staff and I are reviewing our current approach to all of the areas covered by these policies, and wish to share any changes we believe need to be made with you soon.

Our school already takes a strong, positive studentcentred approach, but we want to work with you to ensure, together, every student has the right support at the right time to help them grow into confident, resilient adults.




