The last two weeks have been very busy for us and have included hosting two Kindergarten Orientation mornings as well as continued work with our class maths observations for teachers with a focus on looking at questioning techniques. Exercise Book Pack Orders for 2023

For 2023, we have decided to again order school exercise books that do not need plastic contact covering (easier for you and better for the environment) and are clearly labelled and colour coded for easy student and teacher use.

The company we use is offering these exercise books at a competitive rate. Information on how to order these books will be explained on a note posted to Enews. We ask that you order your child's pack asap so we can have them for the start of the school year. Please make sure you order the correct pack for your child as each year group is different and you are ordering for the year they will be in, in 2023. Any enquires or concerns about this process, please call the school and ask to talk to me.



Classes and Numbers

As the year is drawing to a close, we are currently planning for next year. At this stage, our numbers are still changing daily. Next year we are expecting to make 19 classes (we have 18 currently). These classes will include composite classes, job share classes and single grade classes. Class structure is determined by the staffing formula provided by the Department of Education. The placing of children into new classes is a complex and time-consuming process as each year we strive to ensure that we have well-balanced classes. This process is currently taking place. When forming balanced classes, many factors are taken into consideration: gender, academic ability, special needs such as learning support, English as an additional language or dialect, behavioural and social needs, medical needs and learning behaviours. As this is a very complex task, we do not take parent requests for teachers or for students to be placed together. Teachers use their professionalism as they place students in a class that will best meet student educational needs. Thank you for your support with this process.

Returning late in 2023 and Planning for 2023

If you are returning late to school in 2023 we need to know this information for class planning so that we can go into our 2023 classes with the correct student numbers as quickly as possible next year. For this, we need you to let us know if you are intending on returning late to school in 2023. Please fill out the from later on in the Newsletter.

General Assistant Staffing News

We are so incredibly lucky to have these two amazing team members at HHPS.

School Uniforms

Lately we have seen a few add-ons to uniforms creeping in to school and we have been actively reminding students about the correct uniform to wear to school each day. I am appealing to all families to support our school's high expectations by encouraging students to wear school uniform. The majority of our students are wearing their uniform with pride and this is excellent! Please remember that weekend sports shorts or jumpers from sports clubs are not allowed to be worn at school as they are not part of our uniform. The uniform can be purchased from the Uniform Shop and second-hand items are available for \$5. Please see the summer uniform information late in the Newsletter if you would like a visual of the uniform to be worn. Students wear black school shoes with their uniform and sneakers with their sports uniform. Students wear their sports uniform to school on the days they have sport. Thank you for helping us to continue to encourage students to wear the correct uniform.


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














Fire

STAGE 2 POET INCURSION


