Presentation Day

This year our Presentation Day will be celebrated on Tuesday December 5 across 2 events: K-2 and 3-6. The Dance and Choir will be performing at both events as well as both the performance and Concert bands. K-2 will be singing a song at their Presentation Day. 3-6 will not be performing a song as their events are much longer than K-2. Each teacher will do a short class recognition and some awards will be handed out for each class. Each teacher hands out six awards per class: two are a Teacher Choice Award, two Excellence in Academic Achievement, a citizenship Award and a Commitment to Improvement Award.

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods. We ask for your cooperation and trust in our professional judgement as we make decisions around this. Considerable thought about every students need is taken into account whilst forming classes. All teachers, executive staff and often the learning support team consult and communicate over a lengthy period to ensure every effort is made to achieve the best possible combination of teacher and learning cohorts. Over the course of your child's time at HHPS they will experience a variety of class combinations including, composite classes, mainstream groupings and job share arrangements.

When students follow our school expectations, they receive a Gumnut token. These token go into the whole school barrel and when the barrel is full the students get a reward! Well.... they have done it again and the barrel is full, so we are celebrating with a Mufti Day on Wednesday November 1 (Week

Sun Safety, Sunscreen and 'No Hat - Play in the Shade' Rule

As the weather warms up it is very important to provide your child with SPF 30+ (or higher) sunscreen each and every day. We ask that students wear sunscreen to school and reapply throughout the day. Students may use their own sunscreen (keep in bags) and/or we have sunscreen in every classroom and in the office area as well as in each first aide kit that we take to sport and on excursions. Much of the suns exposure that cases skin damage occurs in childhood and adolescence. It is very important to education and teach our children about how to best protect their skin against the sun. While skin cancer is the most common cancer in Australia, it is estimated that 95% of skin cancers can be prevented through reducing exposure to ultraviolet radiation from the sun. We support students to understand why sun safety is important and to take action to protect themselves. Every child at school needs to wear a hat each day. Our school hats are wide brimmed as these give the best protection for the face, head and neck. If a child comes to school with no hat, they need to either sit or play in the shade. This is our "no hat, play in the shade" rule. Together we can work to educate our children so they are safe and learn good sun safety practices. Mrs Sakajani has spare hats (yellow ones) to lend to children who have forgotten them. This ensures that no child misses out on their sport lesson due to not having a hat.

This term, we are combining Literacy and Numeracy with a focus on using the Frayer Model to build vocabulary in the area of Mathematics.

What is the Frayer Model?

The Frayer Model is a graphic organiser used to develop vocabulary. Information is organised on a grid divided into four sections. The four sections are commonly titled as definitions, an illustration or characterisation of the word, examples and non-examples.

Why are we using the Frayer Model?
The Frayer model assists students to learn

the meanings and applications of new concepts or words.. It assists in activating

what students may already know as well as


linking to new concepts. The visual representation of this model facilitates easy


Join in on the fun!






Can you guess the mathematical term?

Stage One Term 3 Project Based Learning

In Term 3, Year 1 and Year 2 students learnt about Materials Science. They explored different types of materials, and how and why we use different materials for different purposes. For our Project Based Learning unit, Mrs Demlakian, the school librarian, asked us to help her solve a problem:

- How do we protect the library books and stop them being damaged?
- How do we help more students borrow books from the library?

The students worked in small collaborative groups to apply a problem solving design process to solve the problem by making library bags out of recycled t-shirts. The students made some amazing library bags and displayed their work for parents during an open classroom session at the end of the Term 3.

During student reflections, students shared that they learnt how to tie knots, how to make a bag and how to work collaboratively and kindly with others.

We hope to see lots of library books looked after and borrowed each week using our amazing bags!



School Student Travel

Term 4 2023

2024 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a new or replacement School Opal card or travel pass for 2024 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement because of a new shared parental arrangement (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details <u>before</u> the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and travel passes remain valid for the start of the 2024 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2024.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Changes to your bus service provider

Within Greater Sydney, a number of bus service providers have changed their names.

Parents intending to lodge an application for a School Opal card will need to visit <u>transportnsw.info</u> <u>trip planner</u> to obtain the correct bus operator name servicing your area prior to lodging an application.

Travel from Term 12024

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.


