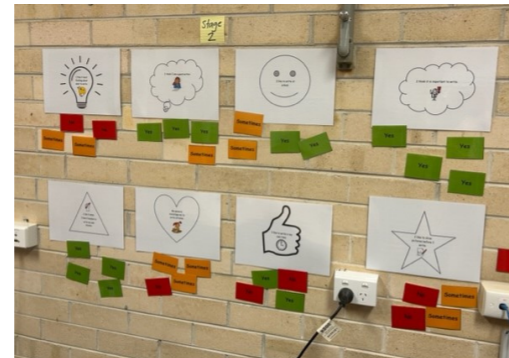

HHPS WRITING FOCUS



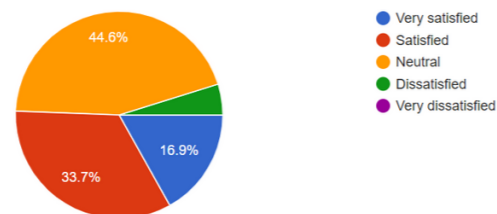
Over the past fortnight, we have been gathering data from our school community on attitudes to writing. Thank you to all families who completed our parent survey and to 66 of our students from Year 1 to Year 6 who participated in a student focus group with Mrs Cornell and Mrs Tudor.



In Week 11, all teachers will complete a writing survey and as a staff, we will be closely analysing all data, as well as participating in professional learning on supporting, assessing and monitoring writing to make improvements to the way we teach, give feedback, and assess writing across K-6.

How do you feel about the writing curriculum and instruction provided in your child's classroom?

One area we already recognised from our parent survey is that families may not have an awareness of the writing curriculum and instruction we have in our school. In response to this, each fortnight, we will be giving you some insight into the subject area of Writing in our newsletter.

The Strands That Are Woven into Skilled Writing (Sedita, 2019)

Critical thinking

- Generating ideas, gathering information
- Writing process: organising, drafting, writing, revising

Syntax

- Grammar and syntactic awareness
- Sentence elaboration
- Punctuation

Text structure

- Narrative, informational, opinion structures
- Paragraph structure
- Patterns of organisation (description, sequence, cause/effect, compare/contrast, problem/solution)

Writing craft

- Word choice
- Awareness of task, audience purpose
- Literary devices

Transcription

- Spelling
- Handwriting, keyboarding

Writing is one of the most complex things we ask students to do and the evidence is clear that very few students become good writers on their own. If we expect students to learn to write, we need to teach them how.

Writing is not caught. Writing must be taught.

Writing demands motor skills, thinking, and memory, and learning these takes time, support, and practice.

As we can see in the diagram above, there are so many skills that are woven together to become a skilled writer. In each newsletter edition this year, we will take you through the following areas we teach in writing:

- Handwriting and keyboarding skills
- Spelling
- Punctuation and Grammar
- Sentence construction
- Vocabulary
- Topic Knowledge
- Organising ideas
- The writing process
- The support cycle for teaching writing

AUDITION

EAL/D AT HHPS

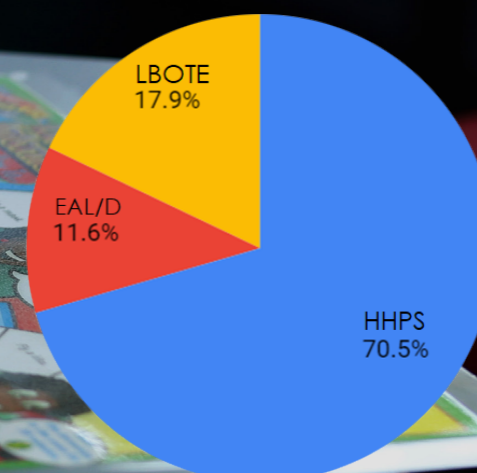
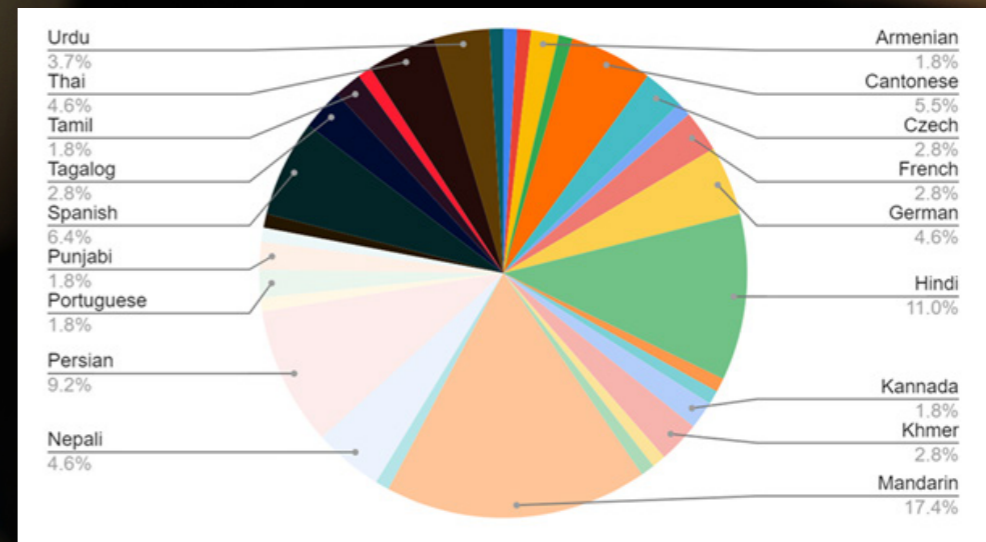

Hello. I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself to you all. I am the EAL/D teacher at Hornsby Heights Public School this year. I have the pleasure of working with students who are learning English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) at the school 2 ½ days a week. This year, the school has also received funding for the New Arrivals Program (NAP), in which I provide intensive language tuition for eligible newly arrived students to our country.

I recently submitted a LBOTE (Language Background other than English) census for the school and wanted to share the results with you. Did you know that at Hornsby Heights

Public School, we currently have students who are from 33 language backgrounds other than English?! Wow! We are so very fortunate to have such a diverse community with students from a wide variety of language backgrounds!

I have enjoyed getting to know the students that i've been working with so far and learning more about their cultural backgrounds and look forward to getting to know more of you over the course of the year. If you ever need to contact me, I am available at the school on Tuesdays and Thursday and Wednesday (half a day).

HELLO FROM THE READING ROOM!

Hello. I have met some of you over the past 13 months, but for families new to HHPS, let me briefly tell you about my role in the school. My main role is to support students who need help with their literacy. I also work closely with the class teachers, providing them with advice and practical teaching strategies to use in the classroom. Students who, for whatever reason, are not meeting stage outcomes in literacy will be referred to me by their class teachers for assessment and further support. We are fortunate at HHPS to have two excellent, evidence-based reading programs that are designed for this exact purpose. The MacqLit program, a small group instruction program, was introduced at HHPS in Term 2 2021 and targets Stage Two and Three students who require further explicit instruction in mastering literacy skills. The MiniLit Sage program, introduced in 2022, is an early literacy intervention program that incorporates the five key elements necessary for early reading programs to be effective: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary development and text comprehension. This program has been developed primarily for Stage One students who have not yet mastered the phonic code or who are struggling to read fluently enough to read independently. Children cease to attend these lessons once reading at or beyond age/grade expectations. How to help your child.

HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD

A key element to children developing their confidence and skills in literacy is reading at home to an adult or older sibling. Frequent, short sessions tend to be more beneficial than one or two marathon (and often angst-producing) sessions. Try to make your reading time together relaxed and fun, which can be challenging at the end of a long day. You may like to take turns reading a page or even a sentence each or use silly voices every now and then. Use the "Pause, Prompt, Praise" method below. If you would like a copy of the Pause, Prompt, Praise card, email the office and I'll organise one to be made available for you.

Reading with your child

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I am also a big advocate for reading TO your children. This can ignite a love of reading, help to develop a sense of wonder and curiosity and facilitates the development of vocabulary, grammar, imagination and the rhythm of language while expanding your child's world. Be a good role model and allow yourself

time to read something YOU love. Make the most of the books that classroom teachers send home with the children and encourage your children to borrow from our wonderful library. Mrs Demlakian has a magnificent selection of titles to choose from and is very knowledgeable about all things "bookish!" Audio books are another wonderful way to absorb a book when everyone is just too tired or when travelling to a holiday destination. I listen to them while I'm cooking and driving. They can be borrowed from most public libraries.
