Sunscreen

The school has sunscreen in each classroom and we take sunscreen out to all carnivals, sports events and excursions. We ask that you get your child to apply sunscreen to themselves in the mornings on days that are hot or have a high UV rating. Each student can use the school's sunscreen or they can bring their own in their bag if they have an allergy or skin irritation and need a certain type of sunscreen. Teachers do not apply sunscreen to children's skin and so students must learn to do this themselves (with our guidance).

Staff Professional Learning

Staff took part in Professional Learning on the two Staff Development Days last week. Our focus was on training and implementation of the new Literacy and Numeracy syllabus documents and programming our units of work for students. Staff completed mandatory training requirements and will in the coming weeks take part in our annual CPR training. Please be aware that our Defib is located in the front office. In 2024 teachers will get some time off class each to learn more about the new syllabus documents as well as assessment time for students in the class.

The Resilience Project

This year we will continue the work we have started with The Resilience Project. The program aims to take on a proactive approach to addressing mental health concerns, improving academic outcomes (when students are happy and calm they learn better) and by improving behaviour. The program teaches about Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness and Emotional Literacy (GEM). Teachers are given professional learning in order to deliver the program successfully and implement it using a whole school approach. Our aim for the year is to deliver a successful program whereby;

- Students connect GEM (Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness and Emotional Literacy) strategies with people and moments throughout the day that make them feel great!
- A culture of kindness that is embedded amongst students, teachers, parents and the wider school community
- Positive teachers who see the benefits of practising GEM by looking after their personal wellbeing
- Students who can manage their emotions and implement strategies to help navigate challenging situations

Each student will be given a journal for the year to compliment the program. These will be invoiced to parents at a cost of around \$20.

After School Buses

There are two types of buses: Public buses and School buses. After school there are the following School Buses;

School Buses: Via Somerville Road to McKay Road 9036 Depart 3:25pm (this loops back to the below 3:44pm bus to Hornsby station) 9033 Depart 3:33pm

School Bus: from School to Hornsby Station 9036 Depart 3:44pm

After school there is the following Public Bus; 3:17pm does the Somerville Road to McKay Road circuit. This is known to the students as "The Early Bus". Only Year 5 & 6 students and their siblings can take this bus.

Teachers will escort students onto the early bus and the 9036 (3:25pm) and 9033 (3:33pm) bus. We do not recommend students take the public bus if they are below Year 5 (unless they are escorted by an adult of course). We understand that each family has different rules that they are comfortable with. The safety of your child/ren is the most important factor to consider.

Does your child use the bus?

Please make sure you share this code of conduct with them?

Behaviour on buses code of conduct

- Use appropriate language not offensive or racist language
- Fighting, spitting, feet on seats, throwing things in or from the bus is not permitted
- No eating or drinking (other than water) - unless for medical reasons or the bus operator gives written permission.
- Offer seats to adults including people with a disability, elderly or expectant mothers
- Do not push or shove other people
- Do not bully or harass other passengers or the driver
- Avoid attracting the attention of the driver except in the case of emergency
- Do not play music at such volume that it may distract the bus driver or other passengers.

Safety on and near buses

- Obey reasonable directions from the driver (for example, where to sit or to remain in the bus)
- Remain in your seat - do not move around the bus unnecessarily
- If standing, remain behind the front passenger seat and always keep a secure hand hold
- Keep bags and other items clear of the aisle

- Do not allow any part of your body to protrude out of the bus at any time
- Wait for the bus in a quiet and orderly manner - including at bus interchanges
- Stand away from the roadside until the bus comes to a complete stop
- Allow other passengers to leave the bus before stepping onto the bus in a single line
- Wait until the bus stops before moving to get off the bus at your designated stop
- Cross the road where and when it's safe to do so, use crossings/traffic lights where available.

Legal considerations on buses

- Wear the seat belt properly adjusted and fastened, if one is available
- Obey the law that bans smoking on buses
- Ensure that buses are not vandalised - report any damage, graffiti and window etching, to the driver
- Do not interfere with bus property, equipment and signage
- Do not leave rubbish on the bus, or at bus stops or interchanges.
