PAXGBG develops students who can be fully attentive and engaged in learning so teachers can use their time and resources to teach.

Bushfire risk mitigation pilot program

HHPS is part of a pilot program which involved the RFS coming to do a site visit in Week 5 along with staff from different areas of the NSW Department of Education. The pilot aims to review the current bushfire risk mitigation policy and measures, and continue to reduce bushfire risk to NSW schools. In partnership with the NSWRFS, a multi-disciplinary team visits each school identified in the pilot to review the school's current bushfire risk and potential opportunities to mitigate the risk. They looked over the school as part of this program. As this is a pilot program, we were advised that the school will receive the results for next year's bushfire season.

Attendance


We want to do all we can to be sure your child achieves their potential and enjoys being in school. We know that school is the best place to learn. By attending school every day your child will get the most out of their learning and improve their career and life options.

When your child is absent it is important you let the school know, including the reason why, on the day or the day before. This helps make sure we know where our students are and offer support for you and your family if needed.

If you are having trouble getting your child to school every day or on time, please talk to our school staff so we can work together, because every day counts. Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can negatively impact your child's learning and wellbeing. When your child misses one day a week that's 40 days of school and 8 weeks of learning in one year. Over an entire school journey this adds up to 2.5 years of lost learning.

HHPS WRITING FOCUS Topic Knowledge and Organising ideas

Teachers need to first consider whether students have sufficient background knowledge about a topic they will write about. If not, teachers need to build the field. This is most beneficial when done through a shared experience so that teachers are able to support students with content knowledge and vocabulary. Some activities we do across K-6 to build topic knowledge:

- Listening to a guest speaker
- Reading a quality text
- Attending an incursion or excursion
- Undertaking a science experiment
- Sharing a cultural experience
- Viewing a website or video

Jointly developing word banks for reference throughout the writing process ensures students have the appropriate language and vocabulary for writing. This will lighten the cognitive load for students as they write, and they will be better able to focus on how to best communicate their message.

What do we do when someone doesn't know how to start the writing process? We ask:

- Who is your audience?
- What is your purpose for writing?
- What is your main idea?
- What is the most important message you want to communicate?

Teachers also deconstruct examples of a piece of writing, using 'think alouds' (a teacher outlines the choices the writer made). They may also do a modelled piece of writing, or 'shared writing' where students also take part in the construction as a whole class activity.



Students have spent time tinkering and refining, giving and receiving peer feedback and then building and showcasing their fabulous purposeful machines!













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





















