Presentation Day

This year our Presentation Day will be celebrated on Tuesday December 10 across 2 events:

> Years 3-6 Ceremony: 9:30-11:30am **K-2 Ceremony:** 12:30-1:45pm

Dance Ensemble and Choir students will be performing at both ceremonies as well as the Performance and Concert bands.

K-2 will be singing a song at their ceremony, however 3-6 will not be performing a song as their ceremony is a longer event.

All students will be acknowledged during the Class Recognition speeches made by class teachers who will then present six Class Awards to their class: two Teacher Choice, two Excellence in Academic Achievement, one Citizenship and one Commitment to Improvement.

Additional Awards will also be presented in the Years 3 -6 ceremony for a range of creative arts, sporting, academic and citizenship achievements.

If your child is receiving a Class Award or an Additional Award at one of the Presentation Day ceremonies, you will be notified during Week 5. This gives those family members who wish to attend the event approximately four weeks notice.

Please note that if your child is a potential House or School Captain (as they have presented a speech in the voting process) then you are welcome to attend the Years 3 - 6 ceremony. However, please note that you will not receive a specific notification

SchoolBytes

This week, the calendar option on the parents dashboard will be visible when logging into School Bytes. This gives parents the opportunity to easily keep up to date with events and happenings via the SchoolBytes parent portal. In our last

newsletter, we reminded parents how to turn on their notifications on SchooBytes in order to receive alerts and notifications. Hornsby Heights will be utilising this function more frequently from this week. We have included the flyers to assist. Please contact the office if you have any questions.



Important - SDD (staff development day changes as of 28 October)

Last week, the Department of Education announced NSW public schools will have additional school development days at the beginning of each term (8 in total per year). School development days are used by schools to build on the knowledge and skills of our teachers, school leaders and school administrative support staff through a targeted professional learning program.

With this announcement the first day for the 2025 school year for students in Years 1-6 will be Thursday 6 February.

TERM 2: Monday 28 April and Tuesday 29

Important information regarding placement tests for selective high schools and opportunity classes in 2025

From 2025, the placement tests for selective high schools and opportunity classes will move from single version paper-based tests to computerbased tests.

There will also be changes to the application process for 2026 entry to selective high schools and opportunity classes.

These changes will result in:

- a more engaging experience for students with computer-based testing
- a longer application period for parents and carers to apply
- more choice for parents and carers of when their child will sit a placement test
- outcomes being released earlier to parents and carers.

The key changes are outlined on this webpage and they have been updated on the relevant pages within the <u>Selective high schools and opportunity classes</u> web section.

The placement tests in 2025 will be held at scheduled times over multiple days (Friday, Saturday, Sunday) and conducted mostly in external test centres (i.e. not in schools). Students will be allocated an external test centre within the local area of their current school.

The 2025 selective high school and opportunity class placement test dates are 2-4 May 2025.

A make-up test date will be available for students who were unable to sit the initial test and who have an approved illness or misadventure request. The make-up test date in 2025 is Monday 19 May 2025. There will be multiple versions of the computer-based test to allow the tests to be conducted over several days. Students will not need to bring their own device to sit the placement tests.

The test structure for each test is not changing in 2025:

- The Selective High School Placement Test will continue to have 4 sections (Reading, Mathematical reasoning, Thinking skills and Writing).
- The Opportunity Class Placement Test will continue to have 3 sections (Reading, Mathematical reasoning and Thinking skills).

Parents and carers will be able to request reasonable adjustments for students with disability, medical conditions or temporary injuries to access the test.

Applying for entry

Applications for selective high school and opportunity class entry in 2026 will be open from 7 November 2024 to 21 February 2025. There will be no late applications due to the longer application period.

This change to the application period means that parents and carers will now need to apply for opportunity class placement when their child is in Year 3 (or by the end of Week 4, Term 1 when their child is in Year 4). This change applies to students currently in Year 3.

For selective high school placement, parents and carers will continue to apply when their child is in Year 5 and can now apply when their child is in year 6 until the end of Week 4, Term 1.

Key dates - applying for entry in 2026

- 7 November 2024 to 21 February 2025 parents and carers apply for selective high school or opportunity class entry in 2026.
- 2-4 May 2025 students sit the selective high school or opportunity class placement test for entry in 2026.
- 19 May 2025 make up test date (approved illness/misadventure requests)
- Term 3, 2025 placement outcomes and offers released to parents and carers
- Term 1, 2026 students who gain entry begin attending their opportunity class or selective high school

Arrival at school

A gentle reminder that playground supervision starts at 8.40am. Teachers are not on duty prior to this time. This term, we have seen an increased number of students arriving before 8.40am. Students who regularly need to be at school before 8.40am should be enrolled in OOSH. We understand there can be one off situations when this occurs such as parents attending a meeting with the teacher. In these circumstances, we request students sit under the upper cola until the playground duty teacher arrives at 8.40am. It has also come to our attention that groups of students are purchasing sweets at the corner store before

school. We have had reports of students arriving at school and then leaving the school grounds to go to the shop and then running in front of cars when coming back to school. This deeply concerns all staff as once students arrive they are under our duty of care and crossing Pike Road is dangerous especially as it gets busier in the morning. Teachers have spoken to the students regarding this and we would greatly appreciate families speaking with their children also, reinforcing that once a student arrives at school, they are to walk directly into the school grounds and stay on site, including when arriving by bus. Thank you for helping to keep your children safe.

PBEL Reward Day reminder: Wednesday November 6




SCHOOL BYTES APP & PUSH NOTIFICATIONS


School Bytes now offers a parent app for Apple and Android devices. This app is designed to complement our existing parent portal, and makes it easier for parents to use School Bytes on your mobile device.

A key feature is the addition of push notifications. Push notifications come from the app on a parent's phone and will pop up as an alert. You need the School Bytes app for push notifications to be activated.

Push notifications will automatically activate when the School Bytes app is downloaded. If you accidentally turn off the notifications, this can be changed in two places.

- In the app Settings → make sure notifications are turned on here
- On your phone Settings → Notifications → find School Bytes in the list and make sure notifications are turned on

OOSH start dates for 2025:

Parents of 2024 Kindergarten children may elect to start their Kindergarten enrolment between Friday 7/2/25 (Term 1 Week 1), and Monday 17/2/25 (Term 1 Week 3). Siblings will still be charged from Tuesday 4/2/25. For permanent places (Yrs. 1 – 6), fees will be billed from Tuesday 4/2/25 (Week 1 Term 1). Non-attendance will still incur fees and absences.

Vacation Care in 2025

All enrolment information that you have given us will be deemed applicable for any Vacation Care utilized during 2025. Booking and permission forms will still be required for Vacation Care at the relevant time.

Requirements to confirm your 2025 booking:

- Our preference is that you bring your enrolment paperwork to your allocated session so we can review and confirm all is complete. We will not accept new enrolment paperwork until **Friday 15th November** unless you attend an enrolment session.
- OOSH enrolments will be confirmed during the enrolment session provided all paperwork has been fully completed. Incomplete paperwork will be rejected and returned. Your booking will not be confirmed until the paperwork has been corrected.
- Pay \$150 bond per family. The bond is fully refundable when your family leaves OOSH. If required, the bond will be used to recover any fees not paid by the due date in accordance with the Fee Policy. A Bond payment is only required if you receive a permanent booking, this can be paid via direct deposit or eftpos at the Centre.
- Confirmation of bookings including waitlist days, will be emailed by **Monday 25**th **November**.
- Immunisation paperwork is required as well as an up-to-date photo of your child.
- All relevant Medical, Allergy, Dietary Action Plans are required for your child to attend the service. Any medications that are named on their plans must be provided in original packaging with the child's name and dose. Children cannot attend the Centre until action plan medication has been provided.



No stopping and no parking

No stopping sign

'No stopping' sign means you must not stop at any point on the road or kerb in the direction of the arrow, unless in an emergency.

'No stopping' areas are sometimes marked by an unbroken vellow edge line.

Restrictions may apply at certain times only. Hours of operation may apply to some signs.

- Disobey no stopping sign exceeds \$320.
- Disobey no stopping sign (school zone) exceeds \$410

No parking sign

You must not park on a road or in an area where there's a 'No parking' sign.

This may be all the time or at certain times, as shown on the sign.

You can stop for less than 2 minutes if you stay within 3m of your vehicle unless you are dropping off or picking up passengers or loading or unloading items.

- Disobey No Parking sign exceeds \$136.
- Disobey No Parking sign (school zone) \$227 2pts.



Obstructing driveways, ramps, paths, and passageways

Why is it illegal?

Obstructing a driveway even if it is to your own property is an offence as it prohibits access for emergency services such as the police, fire and rescue and ambulance.

 Stop on/across driveway/other access to/from land exceeds \$320.



Obstructing a ramp, path or passageway can limited access points for prams and mobility impaired pedestrians, resulting in them having to use the roadway.

Obstruct access to ramp/path/passageway

Double parking

You must not stop or park your vehicle: alongside another parked vehicle (double park) across a driveway unless you're picking up or dropping off passengers, on a median strip.

- Double Park exceeds \$320.
- Double Park (school zone) exceeds \$410 2pts.



Parking Education and Road Rules

Commonly misunderstood parking rules

Discover information about parking and vehicle restrictions in the Hornsby Shire Council area to avoid fines and ensure safety for all road users



Wrong direction of travel

Why is it illegal?

Parking in the wrong direction of travel is dangerous as the parked vehicle must travel on the wrong side of the road when departing. This maneuver exposes other road users to the risk of a head on collision.



- Not parallel park in direction of travel, penalty exceeds \$320.
- School Zone offence penalty exceeds \$387 and 2 demerit points

Bus stop signs

You must not park within 20m before and 10m after a bus stop unless a sign says



Space requirements for parking before or after a bus stop

- Stop at or near bus stop penalty exceeds
- Stop at or near bus stop (school zone) exceeds \$410 and 2 pts.

Parking too close to intersections

Parking within 10 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights is an offence unless the posted sign states otherwise.

Stop within 10 metres of an intersection (no traffic lights) penalty exceeds \$410 and 2 pts.



Parking within 20 metres of an intersecting road with traffic lights is an offence unless the posted sign states otherwis



Stop within 20 metres of an intersection (traffic lights) penalty exceeds \$410 and 2pts.

Childrens crossings

Children's crossings are part-time crossings. They usually operate during school zone hours, and at other approved times and locations.

When a children's crossing is operating, it's marked by red orange flags at both sides. When you see the flags, you must slow down and stop before the

white stripes or 'Stop' line to give way to pedestrians You must remain at a complete stop until all pedestrians have left the

crossing.



If the flags are not displayed, it's not operating as a children's

Some children's crossings are controlled by school crossing supervisors. When you see a supervisor holding a 'Stop - children crossing' sign, you must slow down and stop.

You must remain at a complete stop until:

- all pedestrians have left the crossing, and
- the school crossing supervisor is no longer showing the sign.



- Stop on or near pedestrian crossing exceeds \$410 2pts
- Stop on or near children's crossing exceeds \$410 2pts.
- Stop on or near pedestrian crossing (school zone) exceeds \$544 2pts.
- Stop on or near children's crossing (school zone) exceeds \$544 2pts.
